17.00 – 19.00 Special Session “Future of Coastal Management” organized by the BONUS BaltCoast project as part of EUROLAG8 Symposium (<http://eurolag8.org/>)

Objective of this session is to discuss the future of Integrated Coastal Zone Management, explore future co-operation and funding possibilities, discuss suitable structural frameworks as well as organisation structures.
